PAO FL Wing

Last month Florida Wing had to endure the suffering of another tragic flying accident. Fortunately, no one was killed. The pilot and a passenger in the aircraft were badly hurt. We are all praying for their complete and speedy recovery. It has been said that flying is a dangerous game. Statistics show that to be true. But we, with a little common sense, can minimize that risk to an acceptable level. The new pilot approaches each flight aware of his/her limitations. With book in hand, each step of pre-flight is carefully carried out. Every detail of the planned flight is written out and carefully followed. Instructions are carried out faithfully because that new pilot **BELIEVES** that a mistake could be costly. The mid-time pilot is a different sort of a breed. With several hundred hours under the belt, this pilot hurries through the pre-flight, has a few frequencies written down somewhere, has determined the weather looks O.K., and it's take-off time. (Fuel? Oh sure. There's plenty. The left tank fuel gauge has been broken for the last 3 months, but the tanks were topped off the other day). The high time experienced pilot begins to realize that a lot of luck in those intermediate days and some hard-learned lessons has got him/her to this point. That pilot walks around the aircraft with the book out, a carefully pre-planned flight path, a current weather check, and all necessary charts. Sometimes experience is not determined in hours. What sort of pilot are you? Let's not read about you next.

Only those PAO's who train (2 missions/trainings) and retain (1 mission/training) under one of the following ES qualified PAO's will be certified for 1990: Maj Norm Smith, Cpt Charlotte Rowe, Cpt Marion Welch, Lt Barbara Randall, Lt Pat Witherell. Updates will be given as they are credited. PAO's should obtain a temporary 101 for PA if interested in qualifying in ES as a PAO.

Scrapbooks for viewing and contest at May Wing Conference should be of the following standards: size not to exceed 14 x 17; items should be for 1989 only; your unit's number, names and the year it covers, a list of PAO's, CO's, unit staff and some stats on the unit should be divided between the cover and first page or two of the book; books will also be judged on content, continuity of photographs and stories. Up to 25 points will be given in each area: proper dimensions and basic information; content; continuity; overall quality. Good Luck!

SAFETY

New regulations for pilots:

1. Two or more alcohol or drug related motor vehicle convictions or drug related State actions will be grounds for certificate action against a pilot or crew member.

2. Any conviction that occurred within 3 years prior to the implementation of this rule must be reported to the Airmen Certifica-

tion Branch in Oklahoma City.

3. Any conviction or administration action that occurs after the date of this rule must be reported to Airmen Certification Branch within 60 days.

4. Failure to report even one such violation will be grounds for denial of renewal or suspension of airman certificate.

5. A medical certificate will expire on the 31st day. The pilot must then get a medical examination by FAA at that time.

6. Moving violations will also be reported. No limit has been specified but a pattern would show that a person is not stable enough to fly an airplane, therefore cancellation of his medical certificate can occur.

7. Blood pressure limits. Age 50 and higher without medication.

CRITERIA FOR CADET ACHIEVEMENTS

Cadets applying for the MITCHELL and EARHART Awards must review the time requirements between achievements and assure no less than the minimum time is shown on CAP Form 59-1 or 59-2. National reviews these forms and compares them with cadet's join date to determine this requirement has been met. The cadet and commander cannot certify that achievement 1 has been completed until one month after the cadet's name appears on the Monthly Membership Listing. A minimum of two months must elapse between each subsequent achievement. For example, a cadet with a join date of February, cannot complete achievement 1 until March. He/she cannot complete achievement 2 until May. There must be two months between each achievement, no matter how many days are shown. The join date for the cadet is the month CAP Form 15 is received in National and the cadet is listed on the Monthly Membership Listing. Until the cadets CAP Form 15, with membership fee, are received, they are not a member of CAP and should not be taking part in CAP activities.

WING CADET COMPETITION

1990 Wing Cadet Competition will be held 27-29 April, at the NTC, Orlando. The Competition will be run in accordance with Chapter 16, CAP Manual 50-16. Each team will consist of 16 cadets. Team applications are now due to the Wing Director of Cadet Programs. The letter of application must be accompanied with a check for \$25.00 to be applied to the teams charge of \$320.00 (\$20.00 per cadet) at check in. Upon receipt of a letter of application, a packet will be mailed to the senior in charge of the team, providing all information required for attending the competition.

CAP MEMBERSHIP CARDS AND CADET LEADERSHIP CARDS

At check in for all cadet activities, all persons attending must present a current membership card. Seniors will be required to have the Cadet Leadership Card. Persons not having a current membership card will not be permitted to check into the activity, nor remain at the site of the activity. Senior members planning to check in and remain at a cadet activity must also have the cadet leadership card.

ENCAMPMENT CADET COMMAND AND STAFF COLLEGE

ECCSS will be held 30 June - 6 July for those cadets wishing to serve on the staff for either or both Lakeland and Tyndall Encampments. To be eligible to serve in a staff position, the cadet must have a prior encampment and have a grade of Technical Sergeant or above. Applicants must apply for the staff position desired by forwarding a military style letter to the Director of Cadet Programs, stating the position desired and why he/she feel he/she is qualified to fill that position. The letter, accompanied with original and 3 copies of CAP Form 54, must be submitted no later than 1 May 1990. The charge for cadets attending ECCSS will be \$110.00.

CAMP RUDDER CADET STAFF

Due to the timing of ECCSS and Camp Rudder, the

cadet staff will have two graduates of prior years ECCSS. Prior year graduates of ECCSS wishing to serve on the cadet staff for Camp Rudder must apply for these positions in the same manner as cadets applying for ECCSS. Applications are due no later than 1 May. Cost to be announced.

1990 ENCAMPMENTS


Encampment schedules have been established and dates listed in the Cadet Activities Schedule. Each cadet not having a prior encampment should consider attending an encampment. An encampment is a requirement for the Mitchell Award, as well as any special activity, Wing or National. The cost for first time cadets this year will be \$85.00. Cadets wishing to attend, having a prior encampment and not serving on the cadet staff will be charged \$125.00.

RESULTS OF FLORIDA WING SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Cadets earning Wing Activities will be notified by letter in the very near future. There will be a return card enclosed that the cadets will be required to send to LTC Tom Welch by return mail. This card will state whether or not you plan to attend an activity.
